The new L-shaped building is largely single storey to reduce the visual impact to the surrounding area. It replaces an existing house that is due to be demolished.

The building is principally finished in white render, with black timber doors and window details, and local Kentish Ragstone-clad garage building.

The home provides a master bedroom overlooking the garden, two modest children's bedrooms, two guest bedrooms and a combined living, kitchen and dining space.

The building also features a green roof, solar panels and a ground source heat pump.



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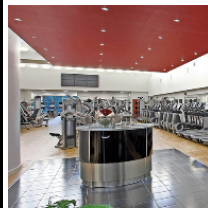


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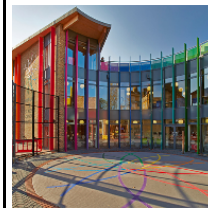
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
